CATS Success Plans are designed to support and educate Student Organizations (SOs) in their decision-making regarding violation of the Code of Student Conduct (Code) and/or University Housing Community Standards (UHCS). The student conduct process is meant to be educational and encourage SOs to consider their impacts on others and remain accountable to University expectations. SOs found responsible in the student conduct process may be assigned restorative actions that align with each category below to facilitate growth and learning. CATS Success Plans vary based on severity of the behavior, impact on the community and past disciplinary records. Below are examples, not an exhaustive list.
